# Sec. 1. THREAT ASSESSMENTS

### a) Definitions

"Harmful, threatening, or violent **ba**vior" includes behaviors, such as verbal threats, threats of self-harm, bullying, cyberbullying, fighting, these or possession of a weapon, sexual assault, sexual harassment, dating violen stalking, or assault, bystudent that could result in:

- 1. Specific interventions, including mental alth or behavioral supports;
- 2. In-school suspension;
- 3. Out-of-school suspension; or
- 4. The student's expulsion.

"Team" means a threat assessment safe and supportive school teastablished by the Board.

b) Threat Assessment and Saáad Supportive School Team

The Board shall establish a threat assessment fendred supportive school team at each campus, and shall adopt policies and proceeds for the teams. The team essponsible for developing and implementing the safe and supportive school parm under Educatio Gode 37.115(b). Policies and procedures concerning the team must:

- Be consistent with the moldpolicies and procedures vdeloped by the Texas School Safety Center;
- 2. Require each team to completraining provided by the TexaSchool Safety Center or a regional education service center regarding exce-based threat assessment programs; and
- 3. Require each team established under this core to report the information required under Education Code 37.115(k) regardingentheam's activities to the TEA.
- c) Team Membership

The Superintendent shall ensure that the newsnlappointed to each team have expertise in counseling, behavior management, notable health and substance use, classroom instruction, special education, school administrations, chool safety and escurity, emergency notagement, and law enforcement. A team may serve more than comepus, provided that class IDEA Public Schools campus is assigned a team.

d) Team Responsibilities

#### Each team shall:

1. Conduct a threat assess t that includes:

- b. Gathering and analyzing data to determine the level of risk and appropriate intervention, including:
  - i. Referring a student for mealthealth assessment; and
  - ii. Implementing an escalatioprocedure, if appropriate based on the team's assessment, in accordance with IDEA Public Schools policy;
- 2. Provide guidance to students and school express on recognizing haful, threatening, or violent behavior that nyapose a threat to the committyn school, or individual; and

- a. A best-practices program or researched paractice under Section 161.325, Health and Safety Code, including the number and paratage of school pleasonnel trained in:

# Sec. 2.Trauma - Informed Care Plan

a) Plan Requirements

IDEA Public Schools shall adopped implement a plan requiring the integration of trauma-informed practices in each school enowiment. The plan must address:

- 1. Using resources developey TEA, methods for:
  - a. Increasing staff and parent awarenestrauma-informed care; and
  - b. Implementation of trauma-infrmed care practices and eary school staff; and
- 2. Available counseling option for students affectedly trauma or grief.
- b) Training Requirements

Methods for increasing awarenessed implementation defauma-informed came ust be discussed in training provided:

- 1. Through a program selected in the list of recommended stepractice-based programs and research-based practice established under Health Safety Code 161.325;
- 2. As part of any new employee orietion for all new educators; and
- 3. To existing educators on a schedule adoptethbyTEA at intervals necessary to keep educators informed of delements in the field.

IDEA Public Schools shall keep records of etratining conducted, to include the name of each staff member who participated in the training.

c) Reports to TEA

IDEA Public Schools shall repositnually to TEA the following information for the school as a whole and for each school campus:
